

Rule of Conduct Of «Crystal Lakes» golf club»



Dress code

A player should be dressed according to the global golf etiquette:

- Polo (collared. T-shirt).
- Slacks or shorts below the knee (for women, skirts and dresses are accepted, intended for golf).
- Baseball cap.
- Sweater or windbreaker (for cool weather).
- Special golf shoes or sport shoes with flat soles.

Players are NOT allowed to wear on the golf course: jeans tracksuits, T-shirts, high heels, swimsuits, shoes with metal spikes, vests, tennis shirts, halter tops and plunging necklines.

Driving range training, putting and chipping greens

Golf- club members have the privilege of practicing from the grass on driving range. Other golfers can only practice from the hitting mats. Golfers have the option of paying for either driving range training only, either only putting and chipping green training, or both trainings.

Juniors (children under 18 years of age) can train only if accompanied by an adult representative.

Care of the golf course

All players should read the guidelines below:

Bunkers.

Before leaving the bunker, players should carefully fill and straighten all the deepening and marks made by them and other players. To do this, use a rake if available near the bunker. If there is no rake nearby, try to smooth out the tracks by feet.

Repairing divots, pitch marks and shoe damage.

Players should carefully repair all the divots they have knocked out, as well as any damage to the green caused by the ball (despite being caused by the player or not). After all the players of the group have finished the hole, damage caused to the surface of the green by shoes should be repaired.

Preventing damage, that can be avoided.

Players should avoid damaging the course and not hitting divots while practice swing or hitting the club head on the ground out of frustration (or for any other reason). When placing flags on the ground, players should avoid damaging the green. To avoid damaging the hole, players and caddies should not step too close to the hole. Caution must be taken when manipulating the flag and when removing the ball from the hole. Do not use the club head to pick the ball from the hole. Do not lean on the club on the green especially when removing the ball from the hole. Before players leave the green, the flag must be correctly placed in the hole. Local golf cart traffic regulations must be strictly followed.

In case of violation of the above rules, removal from the field and fines are possible.

Using a golf cart

Players or Guests under 18 years are prohibited to drive buggies. It is prohibited to use one golf- cart by more than 2 players. It is necessary to use golf- cart paths everywhere possible and to follow the speed limit. Parking of the golf-cart within 25 meters of the green is prohibited. In case of violation of the rules for using buggy, the player will be denied using the buggy again.

Local rules

You can check local rules when you receive you score card and/or on the golf-club notice board. All players are required to comply with them.

Game Speed

The preparation for the strike is no more than 40 seconds. During the practice round, if your group is late, apply the stable fort rule of play: if on a par 3 typo made 6 strokes, life the ball, respectively, on a par 4 - 7 strokes, and on par 5 -8 strokes. Always stick to the group in front- Your task is not to fall behind; ignore the group behind you.

If there is an empty hole in front of you and you are holding up a group behind you, or you are holding a group behind you under a condition when there is no group in front of you, ask the group to move forward. In everyones interests, players should play without delay.

If a player has reasonable grounds to believe that his ball may be lost, then in order to save time the player must put a temporary ball into play (provisional).

The duration of round in golf should not exceed 4 hours 30 minutes.

Organization and rules of play on the golf course.

Create or cancel a tee time reservation

To reserve a tee time, you must call «Crystal Lakes & Country Club» one or two days in advance in order to check availability of the course. The golf club employees must be informed of:

- Desired golf date and time.
- Last name and First name of all golfers.
- Number plates of golfer's cars (for entry to the checkpoint).
- The need to use carts or golf-carts (for advanced reservation and preparation).

Starting groups

Play from a tee that suits your skill level. Always put a provisional ball in play if your ball is being lost in a water hazard or out of bounds. Always have a spare ball with you. Install your bag next to the site tee so that you can quickly change clubs play a temporary ball. Flying partners should not stand directly behind a player or in such a way that a shadow falls on a swing line or ball when another player is about to make a shot. The player whose turn it is to take the shot must be ready to hit (necessary club, tee, ball in hands). The preparation time for the strike is no more than 40 seconds.

Admission to the golf course

Golfers with an official handicap or Green Card are allowed to play on the golf course. Players

without an official handicap are permitted on a golf course only in presence of a golf professional.

The administration reserves the right to complete starting groups. The maximum of players in a group is 4 people.

Walking on a golf course is prohibited. Only golfers and their accompanying persons may be on the golf course with the permission of the Golf Club Administration.

Players should always show respect to other players on the field and should not interfere with their play by any movement, talking or unnecessary noise. The driving range and playing range must be kept quiet to avoid disturbing golfers. Also, when you are at all training sites, you must turn off the sound on your mobile phone.

Penalty for violation of the Rules

If a player is systematically violates these guidelines during a single round or over an extended period, thereby harming the interests of others, the Committee is recommended to take disciplinary actions against the violator. This actions could be, for example, a suspension from playing for a limited time or a certain amount of competitions. Such measures are considered justified because they serve to protect the interests of the majority of golfers who wish to play in accordance with these recommendations. In the event of serious breach of etiquette, the Committee may disqualify a player in accordance with Rule 33-7. The administration of the gold club has the right to unilaterally make changes to the Rules set out in this leaflet.
